#### Uniform

A reminder that this will be the agreed school uniform from September 2023 to be worn by all children.

royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan (no hoodies) with the Herne View Logo grey trousers/skirts/pinafores/knee length shorts or blue/white summer dresses pale blue polo shirt grey or white socks; grey tights black shoes suitable for active primary pupils

PE Kit: white t-shirt (no collar or buttons) navy shorts navy/black/grey jogging bottoms trainers Children wear school sweatshirt/cardigan with PE kit

Swimming kit: swimming costume - one piece not bikini/tankini swimming trunks not board short style towel footwear to walk to pool in

Unfortunately we will have to raise our uniform prices at the end of the school year, as our suppliers have raised their prices. From  $21^{st}$  July onwards, sweatshirts will cost  $\pounds 11.50$  each and cardigans will cost  $\pounds 12.50$ . Orders received before that date will be charged at the current prices. The cost of book bags will remain unchanged. Please be aware we do not sell the uniform to make profit and those in receipt of pupil premium will receive if they wish, 2 free jumpers or cardigans each academic year.



#### **Forest School**

A reminder that children <u>must</u> come to Forest School with long trousers as per the earlier newsletter post this term. Please can children still also bring wellington boots and old shoes as well.



#### Lost property

Please can all families check that the clothes their child brings home are their own. We do have some children with wellington boots, jumpers, hats etc missing that were named, so if your child brings home something that isn't theirs, please bring this back to the school office. We also have a lot of lost property so please ask your child to check there if something is lost. For Silver St families, this is in the covered way by the hall so do look at collection times.



#### Wrap Around Care

Thank you to the families who have been enquiring about the potential for us to expand our wrap around care provision. An email has been sent this week explaining that we can now take more children in after school club and hoping to do the same soon for breakfast club.



#### Jewellery

Another reminder that jewellery apart from watches and/or small studs should not be worn for school unless for religious observance. All jewellery needs to be removed for PE and if unable to remove studs, these should be taped over at home ready for PE days. We will hopefully be swimming soon, and for this all jewellery must be removed so if studs cannot be taken out your child will be unable to swim.

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# **NON-UNIFORM DAY 16TH JUNE**



We will be celebrating our school's Book Week from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> June. As part of this we are excited to announce that Herne View is taking part in a **Read for Good Readathon** and we'd love your child to join in.

It's been proven that children who read for pleasure are more likely to be successful and happy throughout their lives (OECD, 2002).

The charity **Read for Good** encourages children to read through its unique motivational approach that inspires reluctant readers to give reading a go and keen readers to read more widely. Pupils can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics and audiobooks to blogs - they are not being assessed, it's all about reading for fun! And, they are motivated to read because the money they raise in sponsorship helps to provide a regular supply of brand new books and a resident storyteller to every major children's hospital in the UK.
