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Lantern parade – we still need lantern holders

Thank you to everyone who has already volunteered and we have you on the list.

A reminder of the previous article if anyone would still like to join: Looking ahead to the Ilminster Christmas lights switch on we are looking for pupils who would like to carry lanterns in the parade with Father Christmas. Please can families who would like their children to take part email their names to the school office. We will have more lanterns than last year and as last year, we ask that an adult walks with the child and the procession will be finished in time to watch the big switch on. We have had a few volunteers but need more so do encourage your children to join in.

Children and their adult/s would meet on Silver St, around the corner past the Gamesmaster Café between 6pm and 6.15pm ready for the procession to start at 6.20pm. Children will walk in front of the adults supported by staff and we will process up until the Post Office sorting entrance. From there, children will go back with families in lots of time to see the lights switch on. No need for school uniform, more about wrapping up warm for a Christmas parade.



Remembrance

We have been very impressed with how our pupils have shared their reflections of Remembrance. Do try and look at our Y5 and Y6 poems that are on display at the front of each of our school buildings. Y6 are also leading their own Remembrance Service today at the war memorial in the grounds of the old Adult Education building at Ditton St. This commemorates those who died in the First World War who attended the school which was in this building and children will be reading out a list of their names so they will be remembered. Finally, two children who come from Forces families will lay a wreath on behalf of the school at the Minster Civic Remembrance Service on Sunday and displays of further poetry will be shared in school as those attending come for refreshments.

Speech, Language and Communication needs

Research has shown that 10% of children in every classroom have speech, language and communication needs which will impact their learning and future progress, and in some classes this can be higher. It is important that any difficulties are identified early so that children can be given appropriate support to access learning. During this half term, we will be carrying out an online screening of children's speech and language skills using the website Speech and Language Link. This will allow us to identify and pinpoint any difficulties that children may have, and to put the appropriate support in place. Initially, we will be screening all children in Reception and Year 3, but children in other year groups may be screened if we feel they might benefit from it. The screening will involve the children looking at pictures, listening to instructions and answering questions while supported by a familiar adult. It will be run as a fun activity that they will complete as part of their normal school day. The results of the screening will show if your child may need further support, either through the intervention programme given by the website, or through a referral to specialist speech and language therapists. Your child's class teacher will inform you if the screening has shown that your child needs additional support so that next steps can be discussed.

In order for the website to work, we will need to upload the child's name, gender, date of birth, if they speak English as an additional language, and if they are in receipt of pupil premium.

- We welcome cheers but please do not boo
- Spectators, please stand or sit in the place that you have been allocated for the match
- Please respect and accept instructions given by the teacher/coach in charge of the team
- Remember that nearly all those who organise or supervise school matches are volunteers, giving of their time freely and without any financial reward in most cases please respect them for this
